



Operational Overview: All Programs






Monthly Data Feed

- Sierra library uses Create Lists/Export once a month
 - Just added option to automate with SQL server (April, 2018)
- Export includes new patrons and updated stats for existing patrons
- Patron Point does the work of loading into the system
- Polaris uses SimplyReports for query



Operational Overview: Automating Renew




Real Time Update for Card Renewals

- Patron Point uses Sierra APIs to find renewals every day after branches close
- This prevents sending more renewal emails after renewal



Operational Overview: Automating Welcome



Real Time Update for Welcome

- Patron Point uses Sierra and Polaris self registration form
 - New patrons are sent automatically to Patron Point
- This allows us to start the welcome sequence in real time

In 2016-2017:

- √ 768,323 Items Circulated












The Future: What's Next With Patron Point & ILS Interfaces?

Sierra & Polaris

- Automation of data feed
 - Just completed project to automate the data feed using the Sierra SQL data server
 - ◆ Process runs from Patron Point's cloud-based system
 - Query and data processing in less than ten minutes!!!!!!!
- Predictive Preferences
 - Just concluded internal project to use Sierra transactions to predict genre and format preferences for new titles email
 - Predictive system uses format and call number, not titles
- Hot Authors
 - Notify patrons of new titles from their favorite authors
 - Patron Point is looking for a partner for this service. Sierra or Polaris
