From the IUG forum.....

- Very curious about suggested best practices for preparing catalog data for:
 - the linked data based next generation platform
 - -the context based discovery that was recently shown in the March corporate update webinar.

Coming from the perspective of a large library that cannot afford to outsource authority work

- How about a function to systematically suppress and un-suppress authority records so that any invalid headings matching a variant could flipped.
 - Years of not having ARs correctly flip 7xx and then 1xx before 3.4 has left our catalog pretty inconsistent
 - After 3.4 upgrade will do this in batches with create lists and rapid update.
- A wish that AACP could go ahead and flip the headings on incoming records
 - Many vendors supply older iterations of OCLC or LC records with pre-RDA forms of names etc.
 - We now need to edit pre-load or deal with massive headings reports post load.
- Why can't the ILS suppress any AR not used in a bib record, so we don't need to worry about blind headings?
 - load the entirety of the NAF and LCSH and LCGFT into the ILS
 - A script would periodically unspress all the ARs, then suppresses any not in use in a bib
 - Then compile a list of all unsuppressed ARs with 5xx tags and un-suppress the corresponding ARs that would function as see alsos
