




Takin' It To The Streets

The Idea(s)

- Requests for card distribution from schools
 - Traditional means complicated this option
 - LEAP allows mobile registration
 - CaT (Children and Teens) Card allows this option w/o parental signature needed

Pre-Plan

- Review & decide what is needed to get this done correctly

- Committee establishes guidelines for CaT Card

Plan

- Combined efforts to establish committee from all departments
 - All will be involved in this massive project from presentation & visits (YS) to registration (Circ) to use (all PS)
- Team to go to schools including both Circ & YS Staff
- Use LEAP to give CaT cards to all students

Need

- Minimum 2 staff per visit
- Equipment

 - Bluetooth scanner if offering check out
 - Mobile Hotspot school wifi is typically slow and filtered difficult to use
 - Library Cards!
 - Physical print applications just in case 😂
