

Patron Account

Hide the secure record button.

This rule-set hides the secure button on the right of the patron registration form.

Hide the gender selection.

These rule-sets hide the gender selection on the patron registration form.

.gender-container { display: none; } /* radio buttons */

Hide the reading history tab in the patron account.

These rule-sets hide the reading history tab in the patron account. The first hides it in the main set of tabs on wide screens. The second hides it in the “more” menu on narrow screens.

Hold Controls

Hide the place hold menu item on item records.

These rule-sets hide the place hold menu item in item records. The first rule-set hides the item; the second rule set hides the section divider since the place hold menu item is the only element in its section.

Hide the barcode field in new hold screen.

These rule-sets hide the barcode field on the new hold screen (preventing staff from scanning in an item barcode and mistakenly placing an item-level hold). The first rule hides the label. The second rule hides the text box.
